COURSE DESCRIPTION

Among the invaluable creations of Hazrat Mirza Ghulām Ahmad^{as} are numerous books and poems, notably the Arabic Qaseeda written in the praise of the Holy Prophet Muhammad^{saw}. This Qaseeda holds immense significance as the Promised Messiah^{as} declared that its memorisation and constant recitation bestow a deep love for him and the Prophet Muhammad^{saw}. According to his assertion, Allah has accepted this Qaseeda, promising spiritual closeness to those who commit it to memory and repeat it diligently.

The memorisation of this Qaseeda is crucial as it honours and praises the Holy Prophet Muhammad^{saw}. It serves as a profound connection to prophethood and spiritual teachings. The rhythmic and poetic structure aids memory retention, enhancing cognitive abilities. Regular recitation elevates spirituality, instills love for the Holy Prophet Muhammad^{saw}, and brings believers closer to the teachings of Islam as explained by the Promised Messiah^{as}.

This course is offered twice per week and the students will memorize 10 couplets each week. The whole Qaseeda memorisation will be covered in one semester (17-18 weeks long semester).

Upon completion of this course, students should be able to:

- demonstrate memorisation of all 70 couplets of the Qaseeda with correct pronunciation.
- cultivate a profound appreciation for the spiritual significance and reverence expressed for the Prophet Muhammad^{saw} in the Qaseeda.
- develop a strong connection with the Promised Messiah^{as} and the Holy Prophet^{saw} through consistent recitation and reflection on the Qaseeda.
- enhance their memory retention skills through rhythmic and structured memorisation techniques.
