COURSE DESCRIPTION

"Inculcate the habit of reading the Holy Qur'ān in the children and you should recite (the Holy Qur'ān) as well. Every household should echo with the recitation of the Holy Qur'ān. After it, try to read the translation." (Mash'ale-Rāh, Vol. V, pg. 119)

The Holy Qur'ān is the word of Allah, the Exalted which He revealed to the Holy Prophet Muhammad^{saw} in piecemeal. Allah, the Exalted Himself undertook the responsibility of its continuous safeguarding and protection from manipulation and interpolation (Al-Qur'ān, 15:10). The believers are instructed in light of the practice of the Holy Prophet^{saw} to recite the Holy Qur'ān not only in the daily prayers but also outside of them. We find several narrations through the Sunnah of the Holy Prophet^{saw} that he used to recite various verses and chapters in his prayers. In fact, it was the practical demonstration of the command of the Holy Qur'ān [so recite of it that which is easy for you (73: 21)] which we find abundantly in the life of the Holy Prophet^{saw} and his devoted companions.

The course comprises a selection of 13 portions/set of verses from the Holy Qur'ān and includes those verses which Hazrat Khalīfatul Masīḥ V^{aba} usually recites during the congregational prayers. As we can infer from the above quotation of Ḥuḍūr e Anwar^{aba} that reading and learning the meanings of the Qur'ān hold paramount importance. The students are encouraged to know the meanings of the memorised verses. This comprehension of meanings will serve as an invaluable asset in their journey of Qur'ānic memorisation.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

By the end of this course, students will:

- have memorised common Qur'ānic verses recited in congregational prayers.
- be able to follow along during congregational prayers.
- maintain and improve memory sharpness and increase intelligence and mental fortitude.
- cultivate the habit of *Zikr-e-Ilahi*, or remembrance of Allah.
