COURSE DESCRIPTION

History of Islām & Ahmadiyyat is a comprehensive course exploring pivotal events from the life of the Holy Prophet^{saw} to the decline of Muslims politically and spiritually, followed by the rejuvenation led by the Promised Messiah^{as} and his successors. Through lectures and tutorials, students learn historical investigation methods, evidence analysis, and essay composition. Completion of this course equips students with a profound understanding of historical interpretations within the context of Islāmic and Ahmadiyya history. This course introduces students to the fundamental methods of historical investigation; the collection and analysis of evidence, and the preparation of essays and research papers. While content varies, these courses investigate major historical issues, most of which are in chronological order.
